

**Safety plan
for
Trophy Hunting Greenland Aps, fishing trips at Robinson.**

Fishing trips do not involve the big risks compared to many other activities, but there are some things you need to be aware of, because safety is more important than anything else.

Terms in this safety plan are based on both safety and legal requirements.

You must always follow safety instructions from your guide.

The primary risks are:

- Sailing
- Risk of getting lost in the mountains.
- Fall accidents

Sailing:

During all sailing, regardless of whether it is transport to and from camp, fishing trips with the boat, or whether it is crossing the lagoon with a rowing boat, everyone must only wear a life jacket.

When sailing on the fjord with our boat Limbo 565, the safety instructions posted in the boat must be followed. It is cf. The Danish Maritime Authority's rules. So details are not reviewed here.

When crossing the lagoon below the river, there must not be more people or greater weight than indicated on boats.

Risk of getting lost in the mountains:

During the daily fishing days up the river you are on your own, and therefore you should not leave the river, just as you should not go alone.

All slopes go down towards the river, and the river goes down to the fjord where the cabin is. So if you're in doubt, just follow the river down and you'll come back.

THG's guide is not always in the camp, can be out fishing, pick up/bring people/equipment in town, and there may be trips where it has been agreed that you have your own tour guide on the trip instead of THG staff.

If you plan to stay out all night, you must notify THG's guide, or your own tour guide if it is a non-guided tour, and agree when to return to camp at the latest. If you do not return as agreed, or give notice, then THG or the tour leader has to look for you, and if that does not work, alert the rescue service.

Fall accidents:

If you fall and get injured so that you cannot go back yourself, those you are accompanying must go to the camp for help, if you are alone you must wait for you to be found. So it is recommended that you do not go alone.

Remember that evacuation is at your own expense, so remember insurance.

During tours guided by THG, the guide can sail you to town in the event of injury or illness, naturally requiring you to be able to come down to the camp.

Communication and alerting:

Your guide or tour guide will always have communication equipment in the form of Inreach, satellite phone or similar.

There is a backup Inreach set up in the cabin, so in the event of an acute emergency and the guide or tour leader is not there, you can activate SOS on it. But remember, a helicopter will arrive in an hour's time, and you may risk being charged for this, so you should have travel insurance that covers evacuation from the mountain in Greenland. And if you send a SOS for no real emergency you can be sure you will be charged for it.
